Floodwater is dangerous

Never walk or drive through floodwater. It can sweep vou off vour feet. lift cars and carry other objects. Floodwater is often contaminated and it can hide dangers like open manholes.

Stav away from impacted areas. Floodwater may have damaged structures like bridges and riverbanks. and left large amounts of debris.



Listen to the advice of the emergency services and call 999 if you are in danger.

Check with the emergency services if it is safe to re-enter your property, as floodwater can damage buildings.

There could be damage to the electricity, gas or water supply. Seek professional advice before turning them on. Do not touch sources of electricity when standing in floodwater.
