WHERE YOUR  
WASTE IS GOING

If you pay someone to take away your household waste or unwanted items, you must check that they are a registered waste carrier. If you don't, you can be fined £300 or receive an unlimited fine if prosecuted.

To meet your **legal requirements as a householder**, you must:

1. Check with Natural Resources Wales that the person or company you are using is registered. You can do this online at [naturalresources.wales/CheckWasteLicence](https://naturalresources.wales/CheckWasteLicence) or by calling **03000 653000** (Open 9am-5pm Mon-Fri, charged at national rate).
2. Ask where your waste is going.

We also recommend that you:

- Take a photo of the licence you checked in the database
- Note the make, model and registration of the vehicle used
- Avoid paying cash and get a receipt
